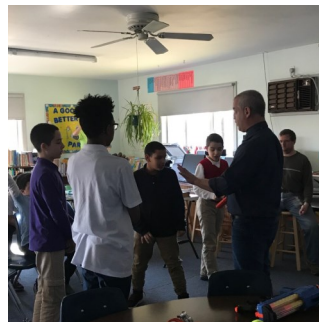
A.L.I.C.E. Active Shooter Response Training

Superintendent Jeremy Garlock, A.L.I.C.E. trainer, visited our school on February 3, to instruct our students in how to respond to an active shooter situation. A.L.I.C.E. stands for alert, lockdown, inform, counter, and evacuate.

Mr. Garlock made a very serious topic interesting and fun while impressing students with the importance of proper response. He demonstrated to the participants examples of what happens if they simply use a lockdown method while hiding under desks or furniture during a shooting. He contrasted the “lockdown and hide” results with being proactive and doing whatever it takes to keep the shooter out of the room, or if unable to do so, using counter measures and evacuating.



After the instructional portion of the presentation, Mr. Garlock took the students through several active shooter scenarios that pitted the student trainees against the “shooter.”



Our school safety officer, Nick Doskisz, and several parents also attended the training.
